East Tennessee Historical Society Honors Hamblen County Man With History Award of Excellence

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., May 16, 2016 – The East Tennessee Historical Society's (ETHS) annual Awards of Excellence were presented at the organization's Annual Meeting on May 3, 2016 at the Foundry on the World's Fair Park in Knoxville. Since 1982, the Society has been annually recognizing individuals and organizations that have made significant contributions to the preservation, promotion, programming and interpretation of the region's history. A Hamblen County initiative was among the 31 awards presented.

 <u>Dr. Marc E. McClure</u> received the *Research Excellence Award* for his research on Kiffin Rockwell. A question sparked by a date on a tombstone of Cocke County WWI hero Kiffin Rockwell started Dr. Marc E. McClure on a research path that has included visits to local sites connected with Rockwell, research into his family and military career, visits to out-of-state research facilities, and finally to a documentary film about Rockwell. In April, McClure screened the film in France, where Rockwell died a century ago.
